We hope everyone has a restful weekend – there have been lots of coughs, colds and tiredness in the class (and school) this week.

For our Big Write this week, the children wrote fantastic and imaginative poems about objects that come to life in the classroom! We have also begun our new writing journey, looking at suspense stories. We began by listening to the soundtrack of a short video clip, 'Alma'. The children made predictions about the genre of the film and what might happen. We then watched the film, in small sections, with the children making further predictions and posing questions to the character. We freeze framed different parts of the clip and described the characters thoughts and feelings.

In our Maths lessons we have generated a sequence, when given the first term and the term to term rule. The children have explored general statements and simplified expressions (e.g. $5t + 3t = 8t$). The children also completed a past Maths procedural paper, the results of which I can share with you at Parents evening.

During our Science lessons the children carried out a science investigation, to determine if insulating a jam jar filled with hot water slows down the rate at which it cools. They wrote a method, designed their own results table, created a line graph and wrote a scientific conclusion and evaluation.
